






GRANDMA THINGS







MAYOR - **Tom Reid** moved to Pearland in 1965. He was employed as an Engineer at the NASA Space Center.

The "City of Pearland" was incorporated in December 1959. Pearland was a "bedroom community" to Houston. The 1970 census reflects a population of 6,444 residents.

Tom Reid was a council member for 5 years and served as Mayor from 1978 – 1990. He was re-elected in 1997 and has served as Mayor since that time. The City has gone through many changes throughout his tenure. The population in 2020 is: 129, 147 – up from 91,252 in 2010. Pearland is the 28th largest city in Texas.

Honoring his years of service the library was named Tom Reid Library. The 95 year young Mayor announced his retirement in 2019, however, there was a delay in the May 2020 election due to Covid 19 and the Election was postponed until November. Mayor Reid will transition to Mayor Emeritus. He is a charter member of the Historical Society.


IRIS KATHRYN 'KAYE' LANE WAGGONER - PHS 1964

FIDEL SANDOVAL, **JR**. was born November 30, 1937 in Brazoria County, Texas, to Fidel Sandoval Sr. and Sarah Esther Delgado. His parents purchased acreage in Pearland and named the road to the property Morenci Street after a town in which Sarah had lived as a child. An Assembly of God Church was built on FM518 and Morenci Street. It was moved to 6711 Isla Drive, Brookside, Texas – and later demolished.

The family moved to Beaumont in 1940; returning to Pearland in 1945. Fidel was the 4th of 5 children: Alice Sandoval Gutierrez {1929]; Joe [1930-2007 MI] Benjamin [1934 – 2017 AZ – Ben was a 1954 PHS grad] and Rudy – PHS class of 1958.

Fidel attended Pearland Elementary and graduated from PHS in **1956**. He was a Guard on the Oiler Football Team – a 3 year letterman.


He proudly served in the U. S. Army.



Jr Hi Football:

December 7, 1968, Fidel married Maria Lupita Flores. He worked for Hollister Framing Company in Houston for several years and then ventured on his own in a successful housing construction company. He subdivided and built the houses on Morenci Street as well as many in Houston and surrounding areas.

Maria inherited acreage and a house in Mexico. They moved to Mexico to enable Fidel to renovate the house; they sold the property after completion and returned to Pearland. Fidel and Maria had two sons: Michael Benjamin Sandoval and Christopher Mark Sandoval.



Fidel was quiet spoken and always the perfect gentleman. A member of the Pearland Historical Society – he attended most of the annual luncheons.

He was a member of the Assembly of God Church on Mustang Road, Alvin, Texas

Fidel passed away September 30, 2020 in Alvin, Texas. A memorial service was held October 2020.

Fidel was predeceased by his wife Maria [1946 – 2004]; his parents Fidel Sr. [1904 – 1985] and Sarah [1909 – 1986]. They are buried South Park Cemetery, Pearland, Texas.

He is survived by his sons: Michael and Christopher, two granddaughters, sister Alice Gutierrez and brother Rudy.

The 1946 Pearland vs. Kinkaid Game

Mickey Mark wrote a story in 2007 about a football game played in 1946 that was partially filmed in COLOR. Tragically new coaches tossed all the game films in a dumpster as well as other items from the trophy case from the old high school on Galveston Ave. What follows is Mickey's account of that game and season.

Tom: I don't remember exactly what I told you about that game, but it was in my junior year, which would have been the fall of 1946. Coach Hawkins had returned from the service in the spring and we were very excited about our prospects for the fall of '46. Our game with Kinkaid was around mid-October. We were undefeated up until that date and were looking forward to meeting Sweeny and hoping for a district championship. Sweeny had something like a 32-game undefeated streak going.

We got brand new all maroon pants and jerseys during the week before the Kinkaid game. We were to play Sweeny in Pearland the week after the Kinkaid game. The game with Kinkaid was a day game at their field. The temperature at game time was in the mid-90s and those new uniforms, which had never been laundered, were very, very hot. They felt like they weighed 30 lbs. when soaked with sweat.

I'm not sure whether it was Coach Hawkins or J.D. Satterwhite who arranged for the photographer to take COLOR FILM of the game. What I do remember was it was a real disaster for Pearland. We were looking past Kinkaid to the Sweeny game and played the lousiest game imaginable.

To add to the troubles, I got a gash over my eye and across my chin in the first half, and Coach Hawkins wouldn't let me play at all in the 2nd half – not wanting to chance further injury. Also in the 2nd half, Wayne Long got knocked cold and had to be carried unconscious to the hospital. He didn't regain consciousness until midnight.

I think the highlight of the film was what you remembered – that is Ed Olin's drop kicking. The Kinkaid gymnasium was behind the end zone on one end of the field and every time he drop kicked an extra point, the ball would go over the gymnasium. As I remember, the final score was 42-26.

The Sweeny team was at the game and later they told us they thought we intentionally threw the game. The next Friday night we played Sweeny in Pearland and wound up with a 14-14 tie. If statistics had been kept, we would have been the winner since we had more penetrations, first downs, and yardage, but no official stats were kept – so we would have to have a one-game playoff in Alvin at the end of the season to determine the district winner. Sweeny won that game 21-19 and ironically Ed missed the extra-point drop kick, which would have tied the game.

If you remember in 6-man football, kicks for extra points counted 2 points and runs for extra points only 1 point. Had we played anywhere near as well against Kinkaid as we did against Sweeny, we would have won handily.

I was very upset when I found out the coaches had dumped all the old game films into the trash dumpster when they cleaned out the dressing room in the gymnasium. There were some really good game films of the Pearland team of 1950, which won bi-district and got defeated by Columbus in regional. I still can't imagine those coaches just dumping the films without saying anything to anyone until after the fact.

That's about all I can tell you about that game at Kinkaid. I still have a somewhat bitter taste in my mouth when I think about it.

P.S. About the drop kicking. Ed Olin was our extra point man - usually very accurate, but Carl Talbot could drop kick farther. One day before practice, he and Ed were seeing how far they could drop kick through the goal posts. Carl kicked one that went 52 yards. I will always remember this.




